- Probably not from a kingly or priestly line
- Name means “servant of the Lord”

Descendants of Esau

- Based on conflict between ESAU and JACOB

“Two nations are in your womb,
two people shall be divided from your body;
one people shall be stronger than the other,
and the older shall serve the younger.”

The Edomites

Descendants of Esau

- **Based on conflict between ESAU and JACOB**
 - **“Two nations are in your womb”**
 - **Did not esteem the birthright**
 - **Disregarded the covenant promises**
 - **Married 2 Canaanite women**
 - **Later married Ishmael’s daughter**

The Edomites

- **Bitter enemies of the JEWS**
 - Refused passage to Moses/Israelites
 - Assisted various attacking armies
 - 4 plunderings of Jerusalem
 - Applauded Jerusalem's destruction
